What is the Harvest Information Program (HIP)?

HIP is a hunter registration program that state wildlife agencies and the US Fish and Wildlife Service use to generate reliable data on hunting activity and harvest for migratory game birds.



Who should be HIP registered?

Every hunter who pursues migratory game birds must sign up for HIP.

Migratory game birds include ducks, geese, swans, brant, coots, doves, woodcock, rails, snipe, sandhill cranes, moorhens, band-tailed pigeons, and gallinules.



Why is HIP important?

During the HIP registration process, hunters are asked **10 short questions** regarding their previous year's migratory game bird hunting. The information gathered is used to identify what types of birds are being pursued.
