

Seasonal Fisheries Aide:

One full-time, seasonal position in the Fisheries Division is located at Wilson Reservoir, Russell County, KS and directly supervised by Travis Riley, District Fisheries Biologist.

Details: Employment will begin in May and last until the beginning of the fall semester with the potential to work through October, if available. Work weeks will primarily be Monday-Friday. 40 hours maximum per week, 999 hours maximum. No paid holidays and no housing provided.

Duties:

- Assistance with standardized and supplemental fish population sampling
- Operate ½ ton pickup and trailer with a variety of boats
- Building and deploying fish habitat constructed from trees and synthetic materials
- Assistance with aquatic education programs (some weekends required)
- Fish Stockings
- Public fishing lake sign maintenance
- Building maintenance and cleaning
- Equipment and net repair/maintenance
- Other duties as assigned

Starting Salary: \$15.03/hr

Minimum Requirements: Currently enrolled in a natural resource program from an accredited University. Preference will be given to those that are enrolled in a fish and/or wildlife field of study. Must possess a valid driver's license. Must be willing to work occasional nights & weekends.
