

Wildlife/Wetland Technician (Conservation Tech)

Location: Woodson Wildlife Area, Toronto Kansas (9 miles southwest of Yates Center)

Responsibilities: Participate in all aspects of wildlife and habitat management on Woodson Wildlife Area, Otter Creek Wildlife Area and Wilson State Fishing Lake. Seasonal workers will gain experience in intensively managed tallgrass prairie, and oak woodlands and savannas. Seasonal worker hired for this position will likely be heavily involved in water level manipulation, wetland management, prescribed burning, and woodland management.

Tasks include: Mowing, Wetland Management, operation of water pumps, prescribed burning, tree removal with chainsaw, TSI, operation of tractors and agricultural implements (disking, mowing, planting food crops, etc.), operation of skid loader with stump grinder and/or forestry cutter, timber stand improvement, litter removal, control of noxious weeds and other undesired vegetation, sign maintenance, etc.

Qualifications: Completed or enrolled in wildlife, fisheries, or other natural resource-related course of study preferred, but not required. Interest in, and knowledge of farming, construction, upland game bird management, waterfowl, wetlands, and/or bottomland hardwood forests will be considered in candidate selection. Must be physically fit and able to perform demanding tasks in a variety of outdoor conditions. Must have a valid driver license.
